Specialist Members

This paper sets out the backgrounds of the specialist members appointed to Development Assessment Panels in Western Australia, and sets out the Panels to which they have been appointed.

BARTLE, Megan

Ms Bartle is a skilled and experienced town planner and project manager. She holds a Bachelor of Urban and Regional Planning from Curtin University of Technology and has more than 20 years experience in local government planning, including six years as the Director of Planning for the Midland Redevelopment Authority. Many of her positions have included the project management of complex projects through to completion.

Ms Bartle was involved in the development and delivery of the Alkimos and Eglinton Local Structure Plans, covering nearly 900 hectares of future urban land. She has previously been involved in preparing planning strategies, progressing urban revitalisation projects, developing precinct design guidelines, and managing land acquisition arrangements.

In his various roles in the department Mr Foley had considerable experience in assessing and determining planning applications under delegated authority from the Commission as well as attending Commission meetings as a departmental representative. His expertise has resulted in him being appointed as an expert witness on planning matters in proceedings before the Supreme Court of Western Australia, the Town Planning Appeals Tribunal and the State Administrative Tribunal as well as under Arbitration.

Since 2010, Mr Foley has been employed as a Professor in Urban and Regional Planning in the School of Earth and the Environment at The University of Western Australia, teaching final year planning students on a part-time basis.
